STUDENT PRACTICUM

This is not a missions trip; this is part of our curriculum that we consider essential to our students training for ministerial deployment into the harvest field. Our practicum is designed to train and develop students to a state of readiness to serve God effectively and efficiently.

Practicum's allow the students to be in the field and creates opportunities for the students to serve in actual hands on ministry of evangelizing, follow-up, teaching, preaching, and ministering to the sick. The students also learn how to work as a team, lead a team, and serve in a supportive role.

This is a life changing experience for our students. Some students are a little apprehensive regarding the practicum, but after they complete their first practicum they realize how powerfully God can work through them and now are anxiously awaiting the next practicum.
